

8301 Edward England, origin unknown, was stranded in Madagaskar 1720 by John Taylor and died there short time later as a poor man.  
 Lk = 18 mm = 1,80 € a piece

8302 Henry Every, born around 1653, was called later Benjamin Bridgeman, was never caught and died in the first quarter of 18th century somewhere in England.

8304 Richard Worley, little is known about him.

**Pirates' flags** (Jolly Roger) of the 17th century piracy.

Some of the pirates had small fleets of ships that sailed under these flags. After a successful counter action by many countries this kind of piracy abated after 1722.

8303 Jack Rackam (Calico Jack), was imprisoned together with the amazones Anne Bonny and Mary Read. Was hanged in 1720.

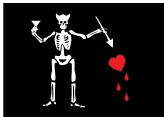
8305 Thomas Tew, pirate with a privateering commission from the governor of Bermuda, he died 1695 in a fight while boarding an Indian merchant ship.

8306 Christopher Condent, he captured a huge Arab ship with a real treasure in 1719 near Bombay. As a result he and most of his crew gave up piracy and negotiated a pardon with the French governor of Reunion. Condent married the governor's sister-in-law and later settled as well-to-do shipowner in France.

8307 Edward Teach, named Blackbeard, one of the most feared pirates of his time. He died in 1718 in a gunfight during his capture.

8309 The second flag of the Bartholomew Roberts, who had the habit to use two different flags.  
 The letters' meaning:  
 1.) „A Barbadian's Head" ( Barbados )  
 2.) „A Martinican's Head" ( Martinique )

 Lk = 38 mm = 3,20 € a piece



8308 Bartholomew Roberts, born 1682, has captured more than 400 ships in his short life. He died in 1722 by cannon fire from English warship Swallow under captain Chaloner Ogle.

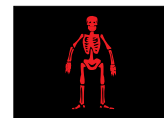
8311 Christopher Moody, the most of his life is unknown.

8310 Stede Bonnet, from the Army of retired Major, retired back to Barbados, was Pirate 1718 and ended on the gallows. To his own people, and also to Prisoners, he was correct and never brutal as it otherwise with the pirates was common.
